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PATHWAYS INTERVIEWS/PROGRAMS...

The initial Year 12 Pathways Interviews were completed in Term 1. Year 12's are now invited to stop by the Careers Centre to follow up on the discussions, research, etc. The VTAC Application Process and Other Pathways Application Process will commence this term. Information will be disseminated via assemblies for both Students (on Tuesday 8 August) and Parents (on Tuesday evening, 8 August, 7pm in our Auditorium) by Mrs Kathy Karlovic, the Pathways & Transitions Leader.

All Year 12 students have attended the Tertiary Information Service (TIS) Event on Thursday 20 July, held at Victoria University, Footscray Park Campus. The TIS event is an introduction to the VTAC Application Process followed by a mini tertiary institutional expo.

All Year 9, 10 & 11 students are also invited to stop by the Careers Centre to book a pathways interview, visit the Careers Reference Centre, collect tertiary handbooks/brochures, etc.

The Careers Program, which officially commenced last term for these year levels with an Introductory Careers Assembly, was administered via their CAPs/MIPS classes. A letter was sent home to parents/guardians via students outlining the Careers Program. The purpose of this program for the Year 9, 10 & 11 students was to investigate career pathways and to select the appropriate electives or programs, either VCE or VCAL and subjects to study in Year 11 or 12, if the VCE program is selected. For the Year 11 students it is important for them to confirm that they have selected the correct program/subjects and to make an informed decision as to which subject they will not continue with the following year (in Year 12). Subject Selection Counselling for all Year 9, 10 & 11 students with their parents was held during Careers/Pathways Week on Thursday evening, 27th July. Letters were sent home advising parents of the details. The Pathways week consisted of a Pathways Expo with an applied and academic focus, a Subject Expo highlighting the programs and subjects on offer at Wyndham Central College for all our Year 9, 10 & 11 students and VCE/VCAL Subject Tasters for our current Year 10 students.

The Careers Centre is open to all students throughout the school day. It is run via interview bookings to ensure students' needs are met. Students may also stop by — an open door policy — for a quick chat, followed by an appointment booking if necessary.

VTAC APPLICATIONS

Applications for TAFE and University courses open on the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) website on Monday 7 August, 2017 at www.vtac.edu.au.

Use **CourseSearch** and VTAC App from the iOS App Store and Google Play (free) as the primary source of course information.

You will also find very useful **VTAC videos** about applying for courses, SEAS, scholarships, offers and changing preferences at www.youtube.com/vtacmedia.

You can apply for **up to eight courses**, placing them in the order you most want them.

You will be **offered a place** in the highest course in your list for which you meet the requirements.

- Don't forget to check out the **Selection Data** for each course for which you apply.
 - Many use only the ATAR for selection, however, a lot have other requirements such as an **audition**, **folio presentation**, **interview or an extra form/documents** that must completed as well.
 - You will NOT be offered a place in any of these courses if you do not meet the selection requirements, regardless of your ATAR.
- You have until 28 September for a 'timely' application. After that, the normal application fee of \$35.00 rises to \$103.00
- Some Bachelor of FINE ARTS degrees at the University of Melbourne (Southbank campus) have an EARLIER VTAC APPLICATION CLOSING DATE:



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- applications close on 31 August for Animation, Dance, Film and Television and Screenwriting.
- For the others, applications close on 28 September and there are no later applications.

- WHAT IF I DON'T GET THE ATAR REQUIRED FOR MY DESIRED COURSE?

Firstly, remember that even if you think the ATAR will be too high for you, **still put your most desired course first in your VTAC application**. ATAR's sometimes **come down** on previous years, and some applicants get in on lower ATAR's because of **bonus points** achieved, or with a **successful SEAS application**, so you might be surprised.

- However, what can you do if you do not obtain a high enough ATAR to access your course(s)?
 Many universities offer pathways into university. For example:
 - Deakin has Deakin College, Monash has Monash College, La Trobe has La Trobe Melbourne and Swinburne has UniLink.
 - Courses at these institutions can be accessed with lower ATARs and usually provide pathways into related university degrees

Many **other pathways** exist, for example:

- Monash offers some diploma programs (in Business, Science, Education & Nursing)
- the University of Melbourne offers a Diploma of General Studies as a pathway
- ACU offers courses through ACUCom (ACU Community)
- **Swinburne, RMIT and Victoria** Universities offer certificate and diploma courses in their VET divisions, often offering pathways to university
- Some **VET providers** (eg Box Hill Institute) have formal pathways to university.

Keep in mind, as noted previously, that some universities allow students to access their courses on **a lower ATAR** as a result of their **involvement in their communities** (eg **Aspire** program at La Trobe).

• ENTRY TO INITIAL TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS:

All universities are integrating a CASPer assessment as a requirement of their admission process for initial teacher qualifications for 2018 entry.

CASPer helps program leaders make more informed and data-driven admission decisions, resulting in stronger, higher quality students and graduates.

The purpose of the CASPer assessment is to determine students' non-academic suitability for teaching.

Course entries on the VTAC website (<u>www.vtac.edu.au</u>) indicate if this assessment must be undertaken as part of the admission process to teacher education courses.

Architecture is also offered at Deakin (Geelong), Monash, RMIT and the University of Melbourne. In addition, the Advanced Diploma of Building (Architectural) is offered at several TAFE Institutes.

This Diploma takes two to two and half years to complete, as opposed to the five-year architecture qualification. The Diploma is also a pathway into architecture.
