Myotherapists are specialists in the **assessment, treatment and management of nerve, muscle and joint health and can help patients with a variety of sporting and occupational injuries and conditions**, and the pain that comes with them.

Myotherapy is becoming increasingly recognised for its ability to tackle the growing amount of **musculoskeletal pain**. It is taught at a number of institutions including RMIT and Chisholm, and at a number of private colleges such as the Southern School of Natural Medicine.
