a character reference.

It's also important to note that scholarships at some universities will close soon.

As discussed in the last Career News, you may need to complete additional tasks to be eligible for selection into your preferred courses.

Please find the information repeated to the right.

Applying for courses via Tertiary Admission Centres (TACs)

Once you've completed your course application, check the inbox in your TAC account for information on additional selection requirements for your preferences. It's crucial you complete these requirements by the due dates otherwise you risk being ineligible for entry into the course.

Examples of additional requirements include:

- Selection tests such as CASPer and the Basic Key Skills Builder Test.
- English proficiency declaration form.
