School Parking

Please see below information from Connect with Us - Road Safety - Wyndham

We would like to remind all schools that we take a proactive approach to children safety around school zones, and we have put a number of strategies in place to ensure drivers doing the wrong thing are held to account.

Parking officers will be out on patrol and will be looking for parking offences such as stopped within 20 metres before or 10 metres after children's crossing, stopped contrary to a no-stopping sign, stopped on nature-strip, stopped double parked, stopped within 10 metres of intersection, stopped on footpath, stopped on or across driveways.

It would be of assistance if you could remind parents in your newsletters that parking patrols are conducted all-year-round every day of the week and that it is important to park legally to protect children and families around schools.

IMPORTANT VICTORIA GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS

Families are asked to support your child to follow the mobile phone use policy and to support your children to become safe and responsible technology users. This is a Victorian Government regulation.

Please ensure your child follows the Mobile Phone Policy for All Schools Students

Victorian schools implemented a mobile phone policy in 2020. This policy continues in 2023.

It helps focus students' attention on learning in the classroom by providing them with:

- (a) a safe environment to learn without inappropriate mobile phone use (including cyberbullying) or distractions
- (b) greater opportunities for social interaction and physical activity during recess and lunchtimes.

 The use of technology is important, but the risks and benefits from its use needs to be carefully managed. A summary of research articles is available via the resources named below. It provides the reason for the policy, including concerns about the impact of overuse of mobile phones on thinking and learning, health and wellbeing.

Students will still be able to bring a mobile phone to and from school, but it will need to be turned off and stored securely away in the school supplied lockers for the entire school day. Parents or carers can still contact their children through the school office in emergencies.

If your child cannot follow this process they are asked to leave their phones at home or hand them in to be looked after for the day.

Staying COVID safe

It is strongly recommended that::

- Parents/carers should complete the Student COVID-19 COVID Test Portal if a student tests positive to COVID-19 (via a PCR or rapid antigen test).
- Students who report a positive result are recommended to isolate for a minimum of 5 days and not attend school until
 their symptoms have resolved. Students who isolate as a result of a positive COVID-19 test will be supported in the
 same way as students with an extended absence due to illness or injury, with learning materials provided to support
 their continued learning.
- A student or visitor who is symptomatic should be recommended to undergo testing for COVID-19. Parents of students
 who are symptomatic should be asked to collect their child from school and to keep them home until they are no longer
 symptomatic.

Rapid antigen testing

It is recommended that rapid antigen tests (RATs) are used by students and staff:

- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild
- If you are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19
- If you are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

The Department of Health recommends that all Victorians should report their positive RAT result to the Department of Health online, or by calling 1800 675 398.

Face masks

Staff and students who wish to wear a face mask should be supported to do so, and schools will continue to make face masks available for staff, students and visitors.

The Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 when leaving home.

Additionally, the Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who has COVID-19, for at least 7 days after a positive test, when they need to leave home.

Ventilation

Schools will continue using air purifiers, external ventilation maximised and good personal hygiene is encouraged.

Remain vigilant for COVID-19

It is important for students to manage any hay fever or asthma symptoms, as these conditions can produce symptoms such as fever, chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, and loss or change to sense of smell or taste, which are similar to COVID-19 symptoms.

If your child experiences these symptoms in different or worse ways to their usual hay fever or asthma symptoms, medical advice should be sought.

Staying safe from mosquitoes

Recent wet and warm weather has increased mosquito breeding. Mosquitoes can carry diseases that may be passed on to people through mosquito bites. A range of mosquito-borne diseases have recently been detected in mosquitoes in northern Victoria. Mosquito-borne diseases can cause serious illness, including infections of the brain, with children particularly at risk.

The best way to prevent mosquito-borne diseases is to avoid mosquito bites.

In line with community health advice, families can protect against mosquito bites by:

- using insect repellent that contains picaridin or DEET on all exposed skin if outdoors when mosquitoes are observed, from October to March
- wearing long, loose-fitting clothing outdoors if possible if mosquitoes are around and covering exposed skin as much as possible.
 Summer school uniforms, including polos and shorts, can continue to be worn, but students should use insect repellent on exposed skin if mosquitoes are active
- limiting outdoor activity when mosquitoes are active.



Attendance / Non Attendance Process - Reminder

Please report all known absences to the Attendance Officer, Ms. Carol Mills by:

 If your child has been absent please send a note with your child including their name, tutor class and reason within three working days to explain his/her absence. For further information please see the Attendance Policy on Compass or the Department of Education parent website.



Fact sheet for parents/carers from the Department of Education

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify their school as soon as possible **on the day of absence** using one of the following methods:

- 1. Online: Log the absence directly using our school's IT platform Compass
- 2. **Telephone:** The school's Attendance Officer, Mrs. Carol Mills on 03 87448900 (Option 1 for attendance) and let her know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason.
- 3. **Email:** Your child's tutor teacher, via Compass and provide the staff with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason for absence.

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Schools need to know when and why a child is absent and you need to know if your child isn't at school.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

What is your responsibility?

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let them know in the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for schools to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details.

Generally one notification will be sent per family. Should there be circumstances that require both parents and carers to be notified, please contact the school to make the necessary arrangements.

What is the school's responsibility?

The school must notify you of an unexplained absence in relation to your child as soon as practicable on the same day. Schools will let you know either by your school's online communications app, SMS, phone call or email. If you can't be reached because the school does not have your correct contact details (i.e. changed phone number, SMS/email failure notification received etc.), the school will attempt to make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school. Where possible, this contact will be made on the same day of the unexplained absence.

Where can I learn more about the process for managing student absences?

Ask your school for a copy of the *Attendance Policy* which outlines the school's processes and procedures for monitoring, recording and following-up of student absences.

Road Safety - Keeping students safe

In the interest of student safety and the efficiency of the school buses, please do not park in the yellow painted curb from **2.45pm-3:15pm.** The school buses experience difficulties turning at the end of the road which delay the service and the pickup of students. This increases the risk to student safety and the damage to motor vehicles.

Please be mindful of parking when picking up your children and do not block the local neighbours' driveways.

Students on school premises Before School & After School

Please see below an extract from Wyndham Central College's Supervision and Duty of Care Policy

Student safety at Wyndham Central College is our highest priority and the safe and appropriate supervision of students is an important element of our duty of care to students. Part of this duty is ensuring parents and students are aware of our student supervision arrangements before and after school.

<u>Before school:</u> School grounds are supervised at 8.30am. The areas supervised are the basketball courts, Shaws Road gate (entrance) canteen area and external toilet block 1. Students are not to enter buildings without staff supervision and not enter the out of bounds areas.

After school: School grounds are supervised until 3.40pm. The areas supervised are basketball courts, bus stops on both Shaws Road and Market Road extension. Students are not to enter school buildings without staff supervision; this includes homework and break time clubs.

Students on school grounds outside these times will not be supervised (unless they are attending a before or after school program or supervised extracurricular activity).

Parents/carers are requested to ensure that students do not attend school outside of these supervised times unless they are attending before or after programs, or a pre-arranged supervised activity (i.e. sports practice).

Families are encouraged to contact the Administration office to speak with the Year 7-12 Assistant Principals for more information about the before and after school programs available to our school community or if you would like any further information about our student supervision arrangements.

For a copy of our school's Yard Duty and Supervision Policy parents/carers can access a copy of the fully policy via the parent portal on Compass or by contacting the school administration office. This policy includes Wyndham Central Colleges' student supervision arrangements across the school day, including before and after school.

Supervision will include the following:

- Monitoring of entry or exit points and/or designated pick up and drop off areas
- Supervision of the arrival and departure of school contract buses

At Wyndham Central College yard duty supervision at the <u>beginning of the school day will commence at **8.30am**</u>. This supervision will include **Buses Location 1 and Buses Location 2**.

Yard duty supervision at the end of the school day will be provided until 3.40pm for all students. This supervision will include Buses Location 1, Buses Location 2, Shaw's Road near the Gate Location 7 each until 3.30pm.

DET - Detention Duty until 3.34pm.

Supervision is provided if students are needed for CAT/SAC resits until 4.15pm.

If a parent, guardian and/or carer (or other authorised person) drops off or otherwise arranges for a student to be on the school premises before supervision commences at the beginning of the day, the Principal or via the Assistant Principals or the Year Level Leaders will, as soon as practicable, follow up with the parent, guardian and/or carer to:

- advise of the supervision arrangements before school, and
- request that the parent, guardian or carer make alternate arrangements.

If a parent, guardian and/or carer (or other authorised person) has failed to collect the student after school, the next steps may include some or all of the following:

- Attempting to contact the parents, guardians or carers
- Attempting to contact the emergency contacts
- Contacting the Victoria Police and/or the Department of Human Services (Child Protection) to arrange for the supervision, care and protection of the student.

Thank you in supporting our students to remain safe by following this policy.

School Nurse

A reminder to ensure all <u>medical plans</u> for your children are up to date. Please feel free to contact Ms. Claudia Jara, the School Nurse on 03 87448900 to discuss any medical needs. If students are unwell at school, they are required to attend First Aid and the school nurse will then contact the family if it is deemed necessary. If your child calls you directly, please tell them to go to First Aid for medical attention. If your child is being tested for COVID 19 or has texted positive, please notify the college immediately. Your child must remain home for 5 days, but if symptoms continue, then please isolate for 7 days.

School Gates

The school gates are closed at 8.45 am to facilitate students arriving to class on time. Students must report to the administration area after 8:45 am, to obtain a late pass. Consequences for lateness will apply. Your child should have a note to explain a known lateness.

Bike storage at school

It is important that all bikes are locked onto the racks with a bike lock or padlock and chain. This message has been communicated to all students however we would appreciate it if you could remind your son/daughter of this requirement. A bike helmet is also a legal requirement. Please note: Skateboards and scooters are not allowed in the school grounds.

Emergency Management Plan

The Wyndham Central College Emergency Management Plan is tested regularly to ensure the safety of all students, staff and school visitors in the event of an emergency situation. As part of this plan we conduct four emergency drills per year, two lock down drills and two fire drills and students are made aware of when a drill is scheduled.

Secondhand Uniform

We are asking for your assistance with donations of any items of uniform that your child/children have grown out of or not using anymore. If you can assist, please drop off secondhand uniforms to the front office and we will issue to other students within the college as necessary. Thank you for your support.



TEACHING & LEARNING REPORT

Welcome to the 2023 school year. I hope that all families have enjoyed a restful break with family and friends and that all students are ready for a successful academic year.

Teachers and students have started the year well. Teachers are planning lessons and units of work using student data, such as PAT tests and Victorian Curriculum levels and NAPLAN. This important data helps teachers to identify where students are at with their learning and assists their planning of lessons to support the learning of all students at their point of need and help the students grow as learners.

NAPLAN 2023

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in Australia do NAPLAN tests. From this year the NAPLAN tests will occur in March. The tests are adaptive which means that the test questions will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going in the test. Students do four different tests: Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. During the tests student will read some of the questions and listen to others with headphones, which the school will distribute to the students at the start of the NAPLAN period.

Students will complete tests questions on the computer. Teachers will help students get ready for NAPLAN tests and will do some NAPLAN practice in classes. NAPLAN is important teaching and learning data and teachers use NAPLAN results to support students in their future learning. Talk to your teacher if you have any questions about your child doing the tests. For more information on NAPLAN, visit nap.edu.au

How can parents help their child feel more comfortable about completing NAPLAN?

One way parents can help is by practicing with their child on the NAPLAN Public demonstration site which can be accessed at the following link: https://www.nap.edu.au/naplan/public-demonstration-site This gives parents an understanding of what NAPLAN involves and the practice helps the students develop their confidence.



The public demonstration tests show the types of questions students will answer and the functionalities that are available in NAPLAN tests.

Students can do the standard tests or they can do a test with accessible alternative items:

- The visual alternative tests include some items with simplified images (numeracy and reading).
- The tests with audio alternative items have text-based items instead of audio dictation items (conventions of language).
- The colour theme tests have different coloured fonts and backgrounds (all domains).

If your child has a disability that requires an alternative format, please contact your child's Year Level Leader to discuss the best way for your child to access NAPLAN. Visit https://www.nap.edu.au/naplan/accessibility to learn more.

Try the demonstration tests by choosing your child's level and then a NAPLAN domain: writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) or numeracy.

Weekly Parent Bulletin Reminder

We would like to take the opportunity to remind you about the weekly Parent Bulletin, which provides important updates and information about school events and activities. The bulletin is sent out every Monday and is a valuable resource for staying informed about what is happening at school.

We encourage you to read the bulletin and attend the events and activities that are of interest to you and your child. If you have any ideas about improving the Parent Bulletin, please do not hesitate to reach out to us.

AVID Binder

All students are supported in developing their organisational skills using the AVID Binder.

- The AVID Binder is compulsory for all students in Years 7- 10 and for the AVID Elective students at Years 11 and 12.
- All students were provided with the AVID Binder Pack and supported to organise their binder on day one.
- Students are expected to take their AVID Binder to all classes. It is stored in their lockers during break times.
- Parents, please check your child's AVID Binder is well maintaned and organised



College Planner

The College Planner is an organisational tool. Students are expected to take the College Planner to all classes.

- Students in Years 7- 10 students will keep the College Planner in their AVID Binder.
- Students will write their homework in their planner each day. In addition, they will write due dates for upcoming assignments, and add important dates, exams or other events in their College Planner.
- If a student needs to leave class, for example, to go to the bathroom, they will be required have a note from their class teacher in their Planner and have their Planner with them at all times.
- Parents are encouraged to use the College Planner as a Communication tool with the College.
- Parents, you can support your child by checking your child is using the Student Planner daily.

Cornell Notes

Students are expected to continue to use the Cornell Note taking format and complete all steps of the note taking system.

- Teachers will support this process in class.
- The completion of Cornell notes must be part of your child's regular homework and home study program.
- Parents, please have a look at your child's work and Cornell notes and encourage and support your child to review notes
 regularly, as this will help your child to prepare for, and improve their test and exam results and therefore promote greater
 confidence in their learning.
- Examples of what students can do as homework each night using their Cornell notes is:
- o Re-read their notes for that day and circle key words and underline important information.
- o Re-read their notes and create questions in the left-hand column of their notes for notes they took the previous day.
- o Create summaries for their notes from the previous week.
- Research indicates that this regular interaction with Cornell notes improves student confidence and success.

Homework Club

Homework club will be running again in 2023. Homework Club is held on Wednesday night from 3:10 pm to 4:00 pm in the Monash Building.

- It is an opportunity for students to receive extra support with all areas of their learning with expert teachers available to help students.
- Homework Club is for all students, Years 7-12.
- We encourage all students to take the opportunity to seek extra assistance from teachers

SORA eLIBRARY at WCC

There are many benefits of reading so it is important to get our students to read and to enjoy reading. WCC offers the Sora eLibrary. Students can access free ebooks and audiobooks from our Sora eLibrary from anywhere and at any time.

Follow the following steps to get Sora eLibrary:

Step 1: Download the free "Sora app" from the Apple App store, Google Play Store or visit soraapp.com

Step 2: Click "My school is Australian Secondary eBooks Now"

Step 3: Search for "Wyndham Central College"

Step 4: Then sign in using your WCC email address and password

Step 5: Browse the Explore tab and borrow a book. Your book will open so you can start reading right away. Enjoy reading anytime, anywhere on a computer, tablet, or smartphone.





CAMPS SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

Please note that if your financial circumstances have changed and you now have a Health Care Card you may be entitled to the Victorian State Government funding to families of up to \$225 that can be used towards costs associated with camps, excursions and sporting events. These funds will be paid directly to the college and can only be used for these types of events/activities.

Eligibility Criteria

Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) application forms are available to an applicant with one of the following on the first day of Term 1 (30 January 2023) or Term 2 (24 April 2023):

- a parent/carer who holds a Centrelink Health Care Card, a Pensioner Concession Card, or a Veterans Affairs Gold Card
- a temporary foster carer
- a student who is 16 years or older and who holds a valid concession card (such as a Youth Allowance Health Care Card or Disability Support Pension Card).

Application forms (available from the administration office) must be completed and returned to the office with a copy of your eligible card for submission prior to 23 June 2023.

Families who applied at our college for this in 2022 will NOT need to complete a new form.

New applications are required in the following situations:

- If a family has a change to their financial situation and are now eligible
- If you are a new family to Wyndham Central College and are eligible
- If you are an existing family who has a new child starting in 2023

All applications are validated by Centrelink and if there is a discrepancy, families will be required to contact Centrelink directly.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL


For the safety of staff and students, all visitors to the school must report to the administration office (including parents/carers) and log into Compass. In case of an emergency, we need to be aware of who is on site.

WHAT IS 'CAREER NEWS' ALL ABOUT?

Career decisions are some of the most important ones of your life, so getting help in making those decisions is vital.

Career News is one source of information available to you.

Career News will be published regularly throughout the year, providing information about how to choose a career, about information sessions being held on various courses and careers, Open Days at institutions where you might want to study, Career Expos, insights into a number of careers, and where you can get help.

Students who do their research during Year 9-12 usually find it easier to make some career decisions at the end of Year 12.

CAREER TOOLS: ONLINE RESOURCE...

RE: wcccareers.com – the comprehensive online careers resource

Wyndham Central College has provided its students and their parents/guardians with a 'School Careers Website'. You can find 'Career Tools' on the Pathways Portal under Student/Parent Links on the College Homepage.

It is a "One Stop Shop" for students' needs with their Career Planning, Information, VCE, Post School Options and much more.

Students can also use it to create and save their resume.

The site is also designed with the parent/guardian in mind, to provide both students and parents/guardians with all the information needed about the students' Career/Pathway Planning and post school options – and the information is constantly changing in these areas.

The Careers Centre, in the Monash Building, is a resource centre for our students with current institutional handbooks and brochures at their disposal. Students are invited to visit, browse and question. An open door policy exits to ensure students make informed decisions about future pathways. Initial Year 12 interviews will take place shortly to assist students with the momentous decisions facing them this year. Parents/guardians are welcome to take advantage of the services provided. Appointments can be made to discuss the future pathways of their children.

HOW CAN I CHOOSE A CAREER?

Many people say that they would like a job they **enjoy**, with the possibility of earning a reasonable **income**. **So how do you choose that job?**

Firstly, keep in mind that there is not just one perfect job for you. There are several jobs that would suit you well, so you need to **explore the possibilities**.

First, think about what you enjoy doing.

For example, is it sport-related, scientific, reading/writing-related, helping people, information technology-related?

What do you enjoy doing in your spare time?

What subjects do you excel in at school?

How important is it that you earn a lot of money?

Answering questions such as these will set you on a path to making some decisions.

If you like science, what type of science do you prefer – physics, chemistry, biology?

If you are creative, what is your speciality - music, drama, art, design?

If it is geography, perhaps you could be interested in urban planning, mapping or surveying.

If it is health, perhaps it is nursing, nutrition or public health.

If it is physics and maths, perhaps engineering.

Do not look too far ahead – you are not deciding on a life-time career. You will have several careers.

WHAT IS A CAREERS EXPO?

As a rule, career expos have representatives from Universities, TAFE's, Independent Training Providers and Employer Groups (eg Defence Force) in attendance to provide information and an opportunity to ask your questions. There are a number held throughout the year, some large ones running for a few days (eg the VCE and Careers Expo 2023 Thursday 4 May, Friday 5 May and Saturday 6 May, @Caulfield Racecourse, Melbourne), while others are smaller regional expos Career Expos are of a general nature and are a good starting point for some career exploration - more information later.

WHAT IS AN OPEN DAY?

Universities, TAFE's and some Independent Providers open their doors, usually once a year on Sundays in August, for the public to see facilities, attend information sessions, talk to staff and current students, and to check out clubs and societies. These are useful for obtaining a more in-depth experience of a particular institution and its courses. Dates will be published shortly (for your diary).

WHAT IS A CAREERS SEMINAR, AND WHY ATTEND?

Many institutions run seminars about particular courses or careers, often on weeknights or in school holidays. For example, Monash and the University of Melbourne run evening seminars on particular courses, while RMIT, La Trobe and Deakin run school holiday programs about their courses (note: this list is not exhaustive). In addition, seminars on studying psychology, sport related careers, and on occupational therapy have been run for many years. These programs give an in-depth picture of courses and career outcomes, and provide an opportunity to ask your questions. More information in later editions.

HOW CAN I ACCCESS UNIVERSITY COURSES?

Many courses accept Year 12 graduates on the basis of their ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank) and meeting any prerequisite subject requirements. Some courses, however, have additional requirements (eg an audition, a folio presentation, completion of a selection kit, attendance at an interview, testing). You are advised to check these out on the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) website (www.vtac.edu.au). Applicants for courses apply on the VTAC website, commencing in August each year. Up to eight courses can be applied for.




